

Roger (II) (iii) de Tosny.

c.1104 – September 1157x62

Father: Ralph (III)(iv) de Tosny (1078 – 1125)

It is recorded that there were five hermitages within the Forest of Conches. At one of these hermitages – that at *Lierru* – Roger (I) de Tosny, seigneur of Conches, founded an Augustinian priory dedicated, like Conches abbey, to St Pierre and St Paul. Roger (II)(iii) de Tosny and his father Ralph (III)(iv) de Tosny, accorded the fathers of the priory many privileges within the Forest of Breteuil.¹

In 1136, Roger (II)(iii) de Tosny is known to have burned the church of Saint-Étiennedu-Vauvray.²

On 9th July 1138, Roger reduced the town of Breteuil to ashes.

Between April and December 1154 Roger is supposed to have been with Henry II, duke of Normandy, at the priory of Lierru.³
