Mor., no.54) [Witnesses: A{dam}, epis.Caithness; master Gilbert, archd.M.; Ada and Robert vicars of Eryn and Dyk; Thomas and Maurice, our chaplains; Laurence and Symone, chaplains of the archdeacon of Moray; Alexander and Henry, our brothers.]</p>

<p>1232 (11 October) Andrew, bishop of Moray, with the advice and consent of the chapter and the assent of the clergy of the diocese, decrees that teinds which have been received from a church for the previous forty years without interruption shall not be the subject of litigation in future.
