20 Aug 1199 x 13 October 1207 - Witness to a charter confirming that John, bishop of Aberdeen, for Arbroath Abbey; has given churches of Inverboyndie, Banff , Fyvie, Banchory-Ternan, Gamrie with chapel of Troup, Tarves with chapel of Futhcul (Fechil), and Coull, to Arbroath Abbey. [Arbroath Liber., no. 198]

1226 (5 May) - Sign as witness a charter of Andrew, Bishop of Moray. [Moray Reg., no. 69] {It is presumed, though not stated in the charter, that this was Henry, Vicar of Kinneddar.}

<p>1229 (St Mark's Day - 25 April?) Agreement between Andrew, epis.M., and Walter de Moravia, son of William de Moravia, regarding the lands he tennants, namely - Butruthyn, Agynway {Aikenway} and Artidul {Arndilly}, and Abirlouer, and Cornekynermuneth {Kinnermony?}, for 5 merks sterling, half at Pentecost and half at Michaelmas (Reg. Mor., no. 33) [Witnesses: Herbert, abb.Kinloss; Thomas, prior.Urquhard; Symone, prior.Kinloss; Radulpho, bishop's chaplain; Henry, vicar.Kinneddar; Waler de Moravia, son of Hugh de Moravia; William de Moravia, knight; Alexander, sheriff of Elgin; Augustino de Elgin; Andrew Wiseman; Symone de Garentuly; Sumerleto de Bucharm.]</p>				
Walter	<i>Vicar</i>	1232	<i>Charters of the Abbey of Coupar Angus, I</i>	
<p>1232 (26 July) - Charter of Andrew, bishop of Moray, granting to the Abbey of Coupar Angus, one dabhach of land at feuferme. The land, called Tullochcurran and which was in Strathardle, Perthshire, was that which Duncan, son of Gillemichael Macath, gave to the bishop in exchange for the bishop's land of Dallas. [C.A. Chrs., I, no. 38] Witnesses: Alexander Douglas, sheriff of Elgin, serviens of the bishop of Moray; Andrew Wiseman, serviens; Nicholas, monk of Valcroissant; Ralph, chaplain of Bishop Andrew of Moray; Simon of Orby, serviens of bishop of Moray; Thomas, prior of Urquhart (fl.1226-32); Thomas, serviens, dispenser (bp. 1232 (11 October) Andrew, bishop of Moray, with the advice and consent of the chapter and the assent of the clergy of the diocese, decrees that teinds which have been received from a church for the previous forty years without interruption shall not be the subject of litigation in future.

Enacted: quinto Idus Octobris - 11 October, 1232.
