<p>1240 (4 September) A determination is made regarding what should happen when one of the Chapter dies - that it was the responsibility of the Chapter to make the arrangements. (Reg. Mor., no.92) [Witnesses: Andrew, epis.M. and canon.Fotherueys; Symon, dean.M.; Ricardus, prec.M.; Lambertus, succ.M.; Willelmus, chanc.M.; Robertus, treas.M.; Ranulphus, archd.M.; Edwardus, canon.Moy; Andreas, canon.Ryny; Johannes, canon.Cromdale; Robertus, canon.Duppol.]</p>				
Thomas Myretoune	<i>Parson</i>	1493	<i>Acta Dominorum Concilii</i>	317
<p>25 October 1493 The Lords of Council decree that John Arnot of that ilk shall pay to Sir Thomas Myretoune, parson of Ryny, the sum of ten pounds Scots, long overdue payment.</p>				
John Leslie	<i>Parson</i>	1549	<i>The Records of Elgin, Vol.i.</i>	95
<p>1548-9 (25 February) An inquest finds Johne McWilliam McAlbin to be nearest heir to his "fader broder" (Sir) Donald Williamson chepland within the Cathedrall Kirk, whereupon (Sir) John Gibsoun protested in the name of Master Johne Leslie, persoun of Ryne, and tutor of John Williamsons, that this decision be of no prejudice to the said John.</p>				

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David Monypenny	<i>Prebendary</i>	1473 1489	<i>Antiquities of the Shires of Aberdeen & Banff</i>	179
<p>Master David Monypenny was prebendary of Ryny, from the year 1473 to the year 1489. In the year 1488 he was amerced in the seventh part of the fruits of his benefice, for contumacy and non-residence at the cathedral . [Moray Reg., 209]</p>				
David Monypenne	<i>Prebendary</i>	1489	<i>Registrum Episcopatus Moraviensis</i>	261
<p>1489 (8 May) At a Convocation it was decided that he should be required to see to the building/repair of his manse in the Chanonry of Elgin. [Moray Registrum, 210]</p>

Alexander Hepburn	<i>Prebendary</i>	1541	<i>The Chiefs of Grant Vol 3</i>	367
<p>7 May 1541. Witness to a charter whereby Patrick, bishop of Moray and perpetual commendator of Scone, with consent of his Chapter, gives and lets heritably to William Grant, son of John Grant of Freuchie, and his heirs, his lands of Vuirfinlarg, alias Mukroth (Muckrach), Midfinlarg, and Nedirfinlarg, with their pertinents, in the barony of Spynie. Given in the Chapter House of Moray. Alexander Sutherland, prebendary of Duffus, was acting as his procurator.</p>

Alexander Hepburn was titular prebendary, Thomas Sutherland, usufructuary, of Rhynie, from the year 1547 to the year 1556.

Thomas Sutherland, having been 'usufructuary' of the prebend of Rhynie, held it personally from 1556 to 1557.

James Gordon, son of the Earl of Huntly, was prebendary of Rhynie in 1560.				
Alexander Hepburn	<i>Rector</i>	1539	<i>The Chiefs of Grant Vol 3</i>	277
5 March 1539. Witnesses an Instrument of Protest by Patrick Hepburn, Bishop of Moray, that he had granted feu-farms of certain lands in Strathspey to John Grant of Ballindalloch and Patrick Grant of Dalvey under compulsion.				
Thomas Sutherland	<i>Usufructuary</i>	1547 1556	<i>Antiquities of the Shires of Aberdeen & Banff</i>	179
Alexander Hepburn was titular prebendary, Thomas Sutherland, usufructuary, of Rhynie, from the year 1547 to the year 1556.
