<div>1526 (8 October) - The Chapter of Moray appeared before a notary to swear obedience to Robert, bishop of Moray. (Robert Shaw, O.Clun., when abbot of Paisley, was provided to the bishopric of Moray on 11 January 1525.)</div> <div>The Chapter consisted of: Robert Reid, sub-dean of Moray; Alexander Sutherland, canon and prebendary of Duffus; John Lokart, canon and prebendary of Inverkeithny; John Hay, canon and prebendary of Duthil; Gavin Lesley, canon and prebendary of Kingussie; Bareldus [Beroald] Lesley, canon and prebendary of Elgin. Alexander Dunbar, dean of Moray was noted as being present also.</div> <div>A notarial instrument was commissioned.</div> <div>Done in the Chapter House of the Cathedral, at about 10.00 a.m.</div> <div>Present: Masters Thomas Gaderar, William Gordon, Thomas Hay, John Robertson and (Sir) David Fotheringham, notaries public.</div> <div>&amp;nbsp;</div> <div>Andrew Scheves, M.A., chaplain of Aberdeen diocese, notary by apostolic authority, acted as notary.</div> <div>&amp;nbsp;</div> <div>[REM, no. 293, p. 372-373]</div>

<div>1546 (12 October) William appeared in the Burgh Court acting as attorney of Alexander, lord Gordon, son and apparent heir of George, Earl of Huntly, to ask for sasine of certain land and tenement in Elgin.</div> <div>Witnessed: amongst others by (Sir) William Young and (Sir) William Hume, chaplains of the Cathedral kirk of Murray.</div>
